The Michigan Department of Environmental Quality proposes to reissue a discharge permit to: the Village of Nashville for the Nashville Wastewater Treatment Plant located at 9500 Greggs Crossing Road, Nashville, Michigan 49073. The permittee collects and treats municipal wastewater from the Village of Nashville. The applicant discharges treated municipal wastewater to the Thornapple River.

The draft permit includes the following modifications to the previously-issued permit: Addition of a load-based limit for Total Phosphorous. Addition of conditional monitoring and a limit for Total Residual Chlorine. Required daily reporting for carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand (CBOD₅), total suspended solids (TSS), ammonia nitrogen (as N), total phosphorus (as P) and fecal coliform bacteria is now specified. Addition of requirements to develop and implement a Discharge Management Plan (DMP). Addition of requirements to perform Groundwater Monitoring for Lagoon Exfiltration and Leakage. Addition of requirements for Water Treatment Additives. Addition of Quantification Levels and Analytical Methods for Selected Parameters.
